29th Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ October 21st

Isaiah 53:10-11

Serving others, dying to self and taking last place rather than first. This all seems like an overwhelming task. Serving means nothing other than giving our lives for others...in other words, helping to make others lives better through our own actions. For what might you be willing to give your life? Is your faith on that list of things you might die for?

Hebrews 4:14-16

In the Second Reading the author speaks of Jesus as "a great high priest." One of the main reasons Jesus is able to have compassion for our shortcomings is because He was tested in every way.
