BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ October 28th

Jeremiah 31:7-9

In the First Reading, the prophet Jeremiah offers his people God's vision for the future. God promises to unite His people from the places to which they have been scattered. Where in your life does this reading offer you hope?

Hebrews 5:1-6

In the Second Reading, the author first establishes the roles and character of a high priest and then goes forward to prove that Jesus met the appropriate criteria, therefore proving that Jesus is superior since He is the perfect high priest. Why is it important that Christ did not choose this role for Himself? Is there any application we can get from here about our own service or ministry?

Mark 10:46-52

In the Gospel, Bartimaeus demonstrates the characteristics of a true disciple: persistent request, immediate response, faith and dedication. He didn't listen to the crowds who told him to just accept the status quo. How can you surround yourself with people who share your desire for Jesus?
