In 1994 Saint John Paul II requested the faithful to take up again the praying of the Prayer to St. Michael in the battle of our times against the forces of darkness and against the spirit of this world. "May prayer strengthen us for the spiritual battle we are told about in the Letter to the Ephesians. 'Draw strength from the Lord and from His mighty power.'" (Eph 6 10). The Book of Revelation refers to this same battle recalling before our eyes the image of St. Michael the Archangel (Rev. 12:7). Pope Leo XIII certainly had a very vivid recollection of this scene when, at the end of the last century, he introduced a special prayer to St. Michael throughout the Church. "St. Michael the Archangel defend us in battle, be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil..." I ask everyone not to forget it, and to recite it to obtain help in the battle against the forces of darkness and against the spirit of this world."

In his recent letter to the people of the archdiocese (posted on the parish website), Archbishop Chaput has encouraged the laity and clergy to pray the *Prayer to Saint Michael* after the dismissal at the end of Mass. We will recite this prayer together at the end of Mass beginning this weekend.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

**32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ November 11th
1 Kings 17:10-16**

In this land of abundance, it may not be easy to put ourselves in the place of the poor widow who has almost no food left with which to feed herself and her son. How the poor widow must have suffered knowing that she could not continue to provide for her son. How could she use the last of her flour and oil to feed Elijah and let her son go hungry? What faith she must have had, and what courage! Do we trust that God will provide whatever we need?

Hebrews 9:24-28

We believe that Christ Jesus has redeemed us by His sacrifice and that He will appear a second time to bring salvation to those who "eagerly await Him." We have an earthly sanctuary and each of us has the opportunity to enter into a place and to participate in a celebration of Jesus' sacrifice for us, not as passive by-standers but as active participants. How can you enter into the celebration of the Mass more fully? Make a plan.
