MORE THAN 20 YEARS AGO, the Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group:

“Lord, as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us to be mindful of those without even a bowl of soup to eat.”

The Souper Bowl of Caring is now a nationwide movement that unites schools, congregations, and community organizations in the fight against hunger. The event has transformed Super Bowl weekend into the nation’s largest youth-led weekend of giving and service.

We here at St Francis of Assisi are teaming up with the Springfield Ministerium and Covenant Methodist Church to collect canned goods, non-perishable food items, and monetary donations on Saturday, February 6th.

On February 6th, Parishioners can leave a bag with canned goods on their door step before 10AM and someone will be by to pick it up and deliver to Covenant Methodist. Alternatively, Parishioners can also drop off items at Covenant Methodist Church.

Packing will be done over a period of several days (Sat 2/6 – Fri 2/12) in small groups of no more than six (6) volunteers practicing safe social distancing and EVERYONE must wear a mask at all times.
